Session 1: Participating in Your Local Government

Tuesday, Feb. 20 in the City Hall Commission Chamber (320 W. Broadway Street)

Learn about the City's organizational structure and administration, as well as how you can be informed, access information and participate in your local government.

Session 2: Public Safety
