- V. **APPROVAL OF AGENDA/MINUTES & COMMISSION BUSINESS**
  - A. Changes/Approval of Agenda – Motion by Busch, second by Fisher to approve the agenda as presented. **MOTION UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.**

- VII. **DEPARTMENT REPORTS**
  - A. Parks – Director Bundy reported on the following capital projects:  
(Prior to flood event)
    - TimberTown 2.0 Grand opening held June 9. Poured in place rubber completed. Lodge area to be completed at later date.
    - Electrical failure at Island Park north restroom lift station; Wastewater Treatment staff investigated and emergency repairs ordered. Company hired to do directional boring to provide new underground power line. Contractor was in the process of boring when the flood occurred. Generator was being used to keep restroom operational for public use.  
(Post flooding)
    - Island Park – all large equipment removed (including above mentioned generator) and saved.
    - All 10 river bridge crossings and 20 abutments inspected with no apparent damage. Rotary Bridge ok. Certified bridge inspector will provide evaluation of all river structures.
    - Many trail washouts and material deposited on trails and in Nelson Park; large sink hole near dam has been blocked off. DEQ Flood Plain Engineer and Rowe Engineering checked dam.

- GRLI Riverbank Protection work sustained damage but held up better than expected.
- Staff focus will be on Nelson and Island Parks, getting them ready to reopen. Shelter rentals moved around to accommodate patrons.

B. Recreation – Director Longoria reported on the following:

- Communicating with coaches and participants re: sporting event cancellations due to flooding.
- Session 1 tennis moved to high school courts. Tennis courts not damaged but needs cleaning; we are planning on Session 2 to be held at Island Park.
- Water Festival scheduled for Island Park South shelter scheduled for July 9 has been moved to Mill Pond Park shelter.
- Farmers’ market is cancelled for June 29 and July 6.
- Adult sports: Kickball relocated to high school j.v. fields. Staff investigating use of CMU sand volleyball courts for remainder of the season.
- USAJO softball tournament cancelled. 108 teams refunded by the City. Several communities have stepped up to reschedule the tournament in upcoming weeks.
- Recreation supplies located in the Warming House are a complete loss, total amount estimated at \$90,000.
- PEAK daycamp was being held at Island Park during the flood event, children were sent to Morey Courts as backup location.
- Camp PEAK started Monday, June 26 at Vowles & Ganiard schools.
